Orange Warsaw Festival 2023

Orange Warsaw Festival

is **OWF** for short.

Orange Warsaw Festival is one a year.

And it is for 2 days.

In 2023 it happens on 2nd and 3rd of June.

Orange Warsaw Festival is on the terrain of Służewiec Horse Race Track in Warsaw.

The address is:

Puławska 266, 02-684 Warsaw.

The festival can be crowded at times. You step out of the crowd or use the space on the platforms.

Category N ticket

Category N tickets can only be purchased by people with disabilities.

You can find information about category N tickets and who can but them in Easy-to-read:

How to get to the OWF

You can get to the festival site in different ways. Choose a way that is safe and convenient.

You can get to the area around the festival site:

- 1. By public transport.
- 2. By your own car: drop off and pick up.
- 3. By your own car: you can park in the parking lot. You will then need to buy a separate parking ticket.
- 4. By taxi.

You can also get there on foot or by other means, such a city bicycle, or scooter.

Public transport: the fastest way to get there

The fastest way to get to the festival is via **M1 subway line**.

Then get off at METRO WILANOWSKA station.

At that station you cany choose: bus or tram.

Buses lines: 192, 709, 727, 739.

From 2:30 pm to 11:00 pm

there will be an additional bus line: 300.

Get off the bus at the WYŚCIGI stop.

Tram lines: 4, 75.

Get off the tram at the WYŚCIGI stop.

Public transport: other connections

You can also get to the festival site from other districts of Warsaw or from other metro stations.

Below is a list of bus lines and trams that get to the festival site.

- from the stop METRO URSYNÓW: bus line 136.
- from the stop URSYNÓW PLD: bus line 192.
- from the stop CENTRUM: tram line 4.
- from the stop DW. CENTRALNY (Warsaw Central Station): access only with transfers.

From each bus and tram get off at WYŚCIGI stop.

One of the stops in the nearby area of festival site.

Public transportation: free rides

If you are wearing a festival wristband you have **free rides on public transportation** in Warsaw:

- \Rightarrow on June 2,
- \Rightarrow on June 3
- \Rightarrow on June 4, until 5:00 am.

You do not need to buy a ticket.

Note: You will get a festival wristband when you enter the OWF festival grounds. You will then hand over your festival ticket.

By car: someone gives you a ride

Someone can give you a ride to the festival.

The car will then enter through the side gate
of Służewiec Horse Race Track.

You need to have category N ticket to use this gate.

You have to show the ticket to security guards.

Someone who gives you a ride can be there only while you get out of the car. Such an arrangement is called: "Kiss & Ride".

The "Kiss & Ride" location is marked by a blue board with pictogram and the words "Kiss & Ride".

It is just next to Priority Service Point.

By car: parking space

You can come to the OWF area by car.

You must the buy an additional ticket: Parking Ticket N.

Note: you must buy the parking ticket N before arriving at the OWF site.

If you want to use the parking spacer you must have **3 documents**:

- 1. Festival category N ticket.
- 2. Valid parking card.
- 3. Parking Ticket N.

By taxi

You can come to the OWF site by taxi.

The taxi can give you a lift to the "Kiss & Ride" zone.

The "Kiss & Ride" zone is in 2 places:

- 1. On Puławska Street, at the main entrance to the festival site.
- 2. Next to the Priority Service Point.

Entrance to the Służewiec Horse Race Track

There are **2 entrance gates** to Służewiec Horse Race Track.

The main gate is on the big street called Puławska. And there is also a side gate: from Wyścigowa Street.

Once you are on the Horse Race Track terrain, go to **Priority Service Point**.

You can as a security guard or volunteer where to find Priority Service Point.

In need – you can use **assisted transportation** to get from the gate to the Priority Service Point.

Ask for support from the security guard or volunteer at the gate.

Entrance to the festival

First, you enter Służewiec Horse Race Track terrain.

Next, you go to Priority Service Point.

In Priority Service Point you exchange the ticket for a festival wristband.

With wristband, toy can enter the festival area.


People from Priority Service Point will help you to get through the gates to the festival site.

Note: you must always wear a festival wristband when you are on the terrain of the festival.

It is a sign for security that you are part of the festival.

A the **Priority Service**, you can also:

- 1. Take audio description equipment
- 2. Communicate in sign language
- 3. Take noise-cancelling headphones
- 4. As for help and assistance.



The Priority Service Point is a white, described tent.

Assisted transportation

You can use assisted transportation at the OWF.

Assisted transportation will take you from the main gate to Służewiec Horse Race Track. This is on Puławska Street.

The assisted transport will help you to get to the Priority Service Point.

If you want to use assisted transport approach the volunteer at the gate and say so.

Assistance

If you need it, a personal assistant can help you on the festival site.

For example, a personal assistant can help you move around the OWF site, from one accessible area to another one.

Festival Volunteers will assist individuals.

They are trained to support people with various disabilities.



Volunteers support the audience during the festival, for example in getting onto the platform near the stage.

Accessibility areas next to stages

There are 2 accessibility areas:

- 1. Nex to the Orange Stage
- 2. Next to the Warsaw Stage

In accessibility areas, there are:

- 1. Volunteers supporting audiences.
- 2. Induction loop.
- 3. Ramps and platforms, so you can better see the stage.
- 4. Access to sign language interpreter.
- 5. Noise-cancelling headphones.
- 6. Chairs.
- 7. Access to electricity.
- 8. Accessible toilets.

Note: Accessible areas are safe. But it is noisy there.

And you can feel vibrations there.

There may be a lot of people.

You may experience the light, sounds and movement on the stage more strongly there.

Getting around the festival grounds

Much of the festival area is pavement, concrete or cobblestone. or paved gravel and sand.

Walking between the various venues on the festival grounds is comfortable.

There are no architectural barriers: for example, thresholds, stairs.

Walking on the ground is easy because there are ramps, lifts and an artificial surface.

Getting back home: public transportaion

How you get back from the festival depends on you
It also depends on what time you return.

In Warsaw, only night bus lines run after 11:00 pm. There is a nigh bus line: 34 that runes next to the festival site.

There will be and additional night bus line, called DO METRA (means: to metro station).

The DO METRA line will run from 11:00 pm to 3:00 am.
The DO METRA line will take you
to the METRO URSYNÓW station.

Getting back home: individual transport

You can return from the festival by taxi or car.

You can take a taxi or a car at the "Kiss & Ride" areas.

Note: returning by car o taxi may be difficult. Late at night Wyścigowa Street will be closed at the end of the concerts.



After the last concerts, all the people leave at the same time.

It is crowded. Everyone goes in the same direction.

Support

If you want to ask for something, if you need support look for:

- 1. People in a t-shirt with the words: VOLUNTEER (Polish: wolontariusz).
- 2. People in uniform or with word SECURITY (Polish: ochrona) on their clothes.

You can always get help:

- A. At the Priority Service Point.
- B. On the accessible platforms by the stages.
